## LODGE HISTORY

The Sippo Lodge #377 was chartered to the Scouts and Scouters of the Buckeye Council of Massillon in 1947. The first Ordeal members were inducted during the summer of 1947. In 1951, the first Brotherhood Ceremony was held at Camp Buckeye. Our first Vigil members were inducted by the Marnoc Lodge of Akron at Camp Manatoc in 1959. The McKinley Area Council of Canton and Buckeye Council of Massillon merged, January 1959, into the present Buckeye Council, making our Lodge the largest in its history with a present membership of 625 . . . members.

The Lodge name is taken from a group of Delaware Indians that once lived in the Canton-Massillon area, particularly in the vicinity of what is now Sippo Lake. Our Lodge totem is a stag's head.
