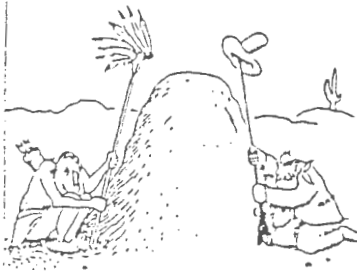

# ARPOWMAN OF THE ISSUE

## Oldest scout Chic Roessler dead at 89

Charles Clifford "Chic" Roessler, 89, of 417 E. Third St., one of the oldest Boy Scouts in the country, died today at 5:25 a.m. at Salem Community Hospital following a brief illness.

Roessler was honored in May 1986 by Ben Love of Irving, Texas, Chief Scout Executive of the Boy Scouts of America, who presented him the 75-year Veteran Award for continuous work in scouting from the Columbiana County Council of the Boy Scouts of America.

Born Jan. 26, 1901 in Salem, he was the son of the late Edward and Hanora (Cahill) Roessler, and lived in Salem for the past 15 years, coming from Lisbon.

Roessler, a 1920 graduate of Salem High School, joined the Boy Scouts in 1911, a year after scouting was incorporated in this country and was one of the first scouts in the United States to receive the Eagle Scout award — in 1916.

Among his many honors were the Silver Beaver Award, the God and Country Award and the District Award of Merit. He was a charter and life member of the Order of the Arrow and has served

as a scout master, district commissioner, council commissioner and council field commissioner for Explorers. During World War II he was a leader of the Sea Scouts and Air Scouts.

Roessler also served on the executive board of the Columbiana County Council in addition to work as a summer camp director, Explorer advisor and district committeeman.

In 1979, when he was 78, he retired from the traffic department at the Church Budget Co., follow-

ing 55 years of service. He was a member of the Lisbon First United Methodist Church and a life member of Eagle Scouts, Youngstown Traffic Club and AARP.
