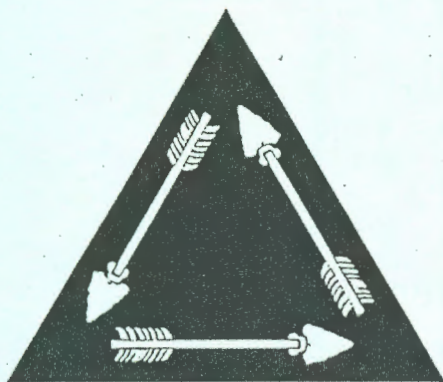

The Vigil Honor

The Vigil Honor is the highest honor that the Order of the Arrow can bestow upon its members for service to their lodge and local council. It dates back to the year 1915, when the O.A.s founder, E. Urner Goodman, became the first Vigil Honor member. Since then, thousands of members have been accorded this honor.

It is a high mark of distinction and recognition reserved for those Scout, Explorer, and Scouter members of the Order who, by reason of exceptional service, personal effort, and unselfish interest, have made distinguished contributions beyond the immediate responsibilities of their position or office to one or more of the following: their lodge, the Order of the Arrow, Scouting, or their Scout camp. Under no circumstances should tenure in Scouting or the Order be considered as ample reason for the Vigil Honor recommendation.

Vigil Honor members have an honorable tradition to uphold. They must at all times conduct themselves in accordance with the ideals of Scouting, the Order of the Arrow, and the Vigil Honor. Membership can not be won by a persons conscious endeavor. It comes as a recognition of his altruistic leadership in service. This fact should be given careful consideration in the selection of candidates for membership. The Vigil Honor has successfully fulfilled a very definite and satisfactory service to the Order of the Arrow, to Scouting, and to the individual members. Its continued success depends on the care with which future members are selected and on the maintenance by its members of the high ideals of service to others for which the Vigil Honor has always been Known.
