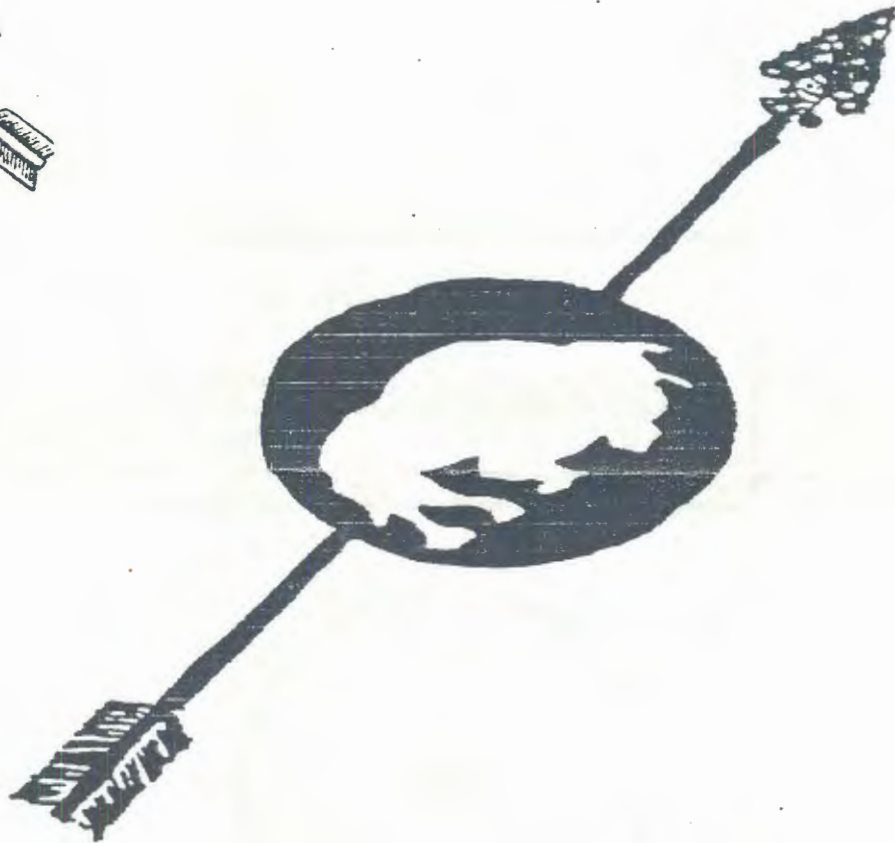

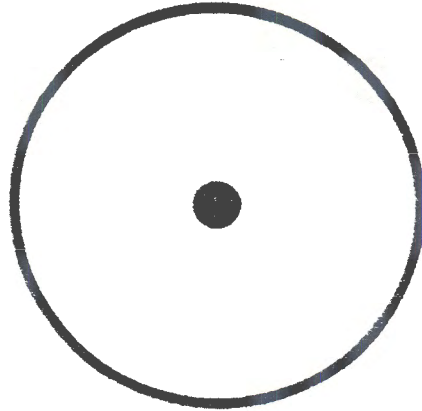

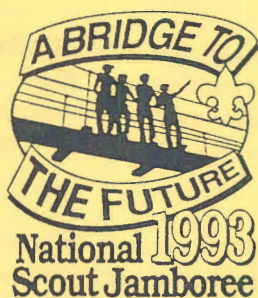

# Facts About the 1993 National Scout Jamboree

## Location

The 1993 National Scout Jamboree will be held from August 4 through August 10, 1993, at Fort A.P. Hill near Fredericksburg, Va. This is the historic area of Washington, D.C., Colonial Williamsburg, Yorktown, Richmond, and Norfolk, Va.

## Theme

The theme for the 13th national jamboree is "A Bridge to the Future."

## Objectives

Objectives of the 1993 jamboree are to:

- ⊕ Give boys and leaders a clearer understanding of, and a deeper sense of commitment to, the ideals of Scouting.
- ⊕ Demonstrate to America and to the world that camaraderie and the objectives of a great youth movement in a free society can be attained, even during a huge gathering.
- ⊕ Emphasize physical fitness and conservation of natural resources in today's world.
- ⊕ Establish and promulgate Scouting activities and methods that will find their way into the program of posts, teams, and troops across the nation.

## Participants

The jamboree is being planned for about 34,000 participants—27,200 Boy Scouts and 2,800 troop leaders in 700 troops, plus some 4,000 staff members for headquarters services, 6 regional camps, and 19 subcamps.

## Qualifications

Scouts who participate in the 1993 jamboree are selected by the more than 400 local councils. Each Scout must:

- ⊕ Be a Scout who has completed the sixth grade or at least 12 years of age and First Class Scout by July 1, 1993, but not have reached his 18th birthday by September 1, 1993.
- ⊕ Participate in the pre-jamboree training experience.
- ⊕ File a personal health and medical record prior to the pre-jamboree training.
- ⊕ Have been active in a troop for at least 6 months prior to July 1, 1993.
- ⊕ Be approved by his Scoutmaster or Varsity Scout Coach.
- ⊕ Be approved by the local council.

Program features will reflect the skills of Scouting, the nation's heritage, physical fitness, conservation, and the spirit of brotherhood. Daily activities will offer fun and challenges, and religious services will provide time for reflection. A cavalcade of highlight events will further depict the rich heritage of Scouting.

Scouts will practice and demonstrate skills such as archery, orienteering, challenge valley obstacle course, marksmanship, boating, canoeing, and hunter safety, as well as take part in updated versions of the traditional handicap awareness trail, competitive events, merit badge midway, and arts and science fair. Scouts also will meet at troop, intertroop, subcamp, and regional campfires and at the arena show.

Many of the normal services for a city of 34,000 will be available for the week of the jamboree. Amid thousands of colorful tents that house the Scouts, there will be community services, such as a bus system, telephones, a hospital and first aid stations, a postal service, food warehouses, a daily newspaper, and stores (trading posts) that will offer equipment, souvenirs, sundries, snacks, and photo services.
