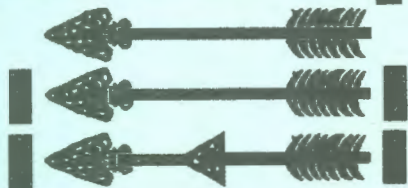

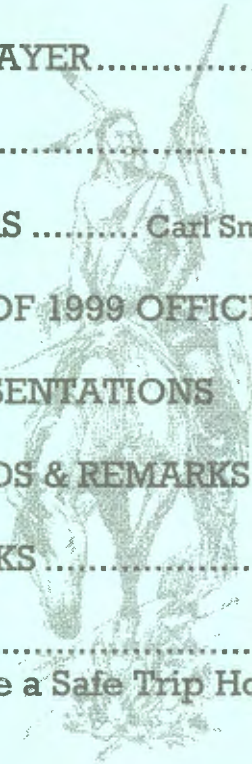

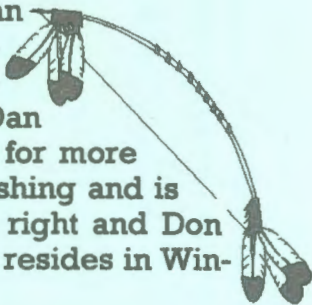
### Carl Smith

### Don Roberts

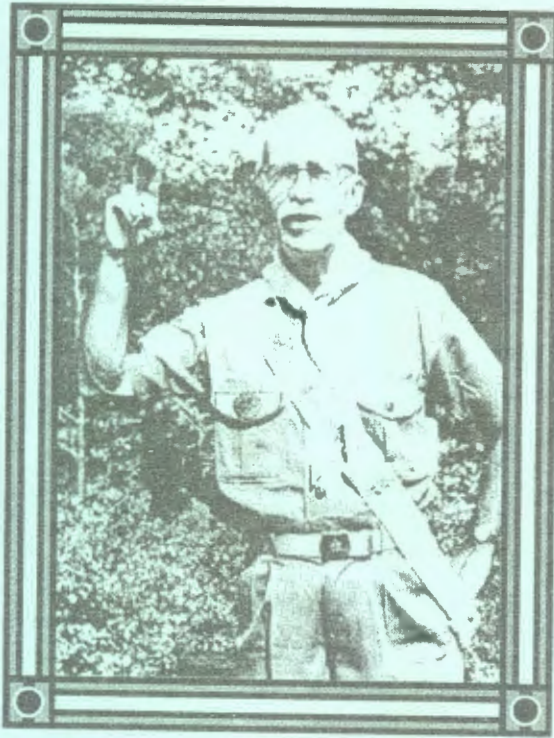
