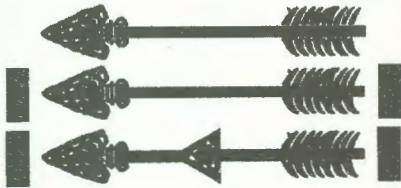

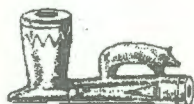

Evening Program



Tonight , we are pleased to have Mr. Dan Minard to speak on and demonstrate the art of flint knapping.

Mr. Minard is a lifelong resident of Ohio and was born and grew up in the Portage Lakes Area. His great grandfather (his father's, mother's father) was a full blood Cherokee Indian which makes him 1/8 Cherokee. His interest in Indian Lore began at age 10 when he would pick up arrowheads while working in the family garden. Stories about his great grandad being an Indian fanned the flames of that interest. In 1993 he decided to learn the art of flint knapping and has been doing it since then. Dan states, "Flint knapping is a lost art an I enjoy teaching it to others." He conducts regular classes in the art at his shop in Canal Fulton and also presents twice yearly seminars at the Log Cabin Gun Shop in Lodi, Ohio. He can also be seen demonstrating the art at area events such as The Great Trail Festival in Malvern, Ohio.

Dan and his wife started a little home business called "Woodland Originals" to sell his art. It takes its name from the fact that most of the flint pieces that he makes were typical to the Woodland period of about 2000 years ago. Visit them on the Internet at www.woodlandoriginals.com.

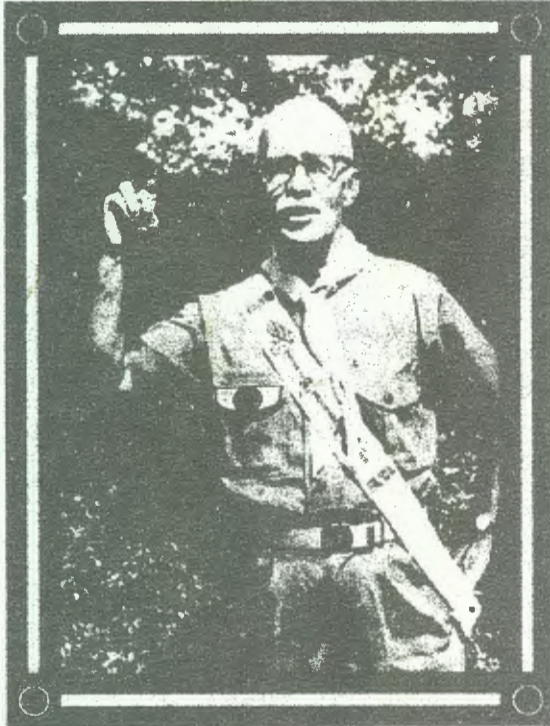
