# Meeting and Election of Officers

Sipp-O Local Rules proposed changes: There will be an Executive Committee meeting and an open meeting of the entire membership at 1:00 pm at the Fall Fellowship to consider changes to our Sipp-O Local Rules (constitution or by-laws). You may view the current Rules and the proposed new Rules on the Sipp-O Museum website (www.sippomuseum.org). Most changes are minor and consist of language corrections and clarifications. There are two new sections: the procedure for selecting members for the Founder's Award, and a section on the Sipp-O Museum. The Rule changes will take place upon approval by a majority of those present in good standing. Only youth are allowed to vote.

Elections for Lodge officers will be held after dinner at 7p.m. Elections will be held for Lodge Chief, Administrative Vice-Chief, Activities Vice-Chief, Vice-Chief of Districts, Membership Secretary, Recording Secretary, and Treasurer. Candidates for Lodge Chief must make an appointment and meet with the Supreme Chief of the Fire (Mr. Truax) before the election. Candidates must be current in dues and under 21 for the entire term of office. Nominations will be held after lunch and again before elections begin. A candidate must be present to accept nomination. Only youth and the elections team may attend the election, although all members can attend the noon nomination session. Youth interested in taking responsibility for the Lodge administration should consider running for an office or service as a committee member or chair. Any youth member is eligible to run for any office -- there is no test of honor level or tenure in order to serve.

### **Brotherhood**

Another important activity that is vital to a healthy Lodge is Brotherhood conversion. There are aspects of this important time including The Brotherhood Hike, The Letter and the Knowledge one must retain to become a functioning and active Brotherhood member. Would you consider coming alongside an Arrowman, new or old, and helping them to achieve? There is a wonderful bond that develops between brothers when one says, "come with me and we will do this together".

### **Indian Activities**

We are always looking for new costumes and physical items to enhance our presentations. Recently one of our drums failed and we had to replace the drum head. What a fun project. Elk rawhide was purchased, soaked to soften and then laced and stretched across the frame. The secret is

in using the elk hide. When it dries, it produces a wonderful vibrato sound. Checkout the callout drum the next time you are at camp. The sound is distinctive and I think, the artwork turned out great.

We were also able to purchase two new, readymade double trailer headdresses. One has been reserved for the Vigil ceremonies. What will we do with the other bonnet? District kits are in constant need of updating. Please contact our adult IA adviser, Chadd Kasper (chadd@kasperonline.net) for what it would take to obtain another piece for your kit.

Remember, that during the off-season we all work together to rebuild our kits. Sometimes we tan hides, repair headdresses, sew shirts, cutout and lace moccasins or even boil deer toes to make Ordeal necklaces. Keep an eye out for those crafting sessions.
