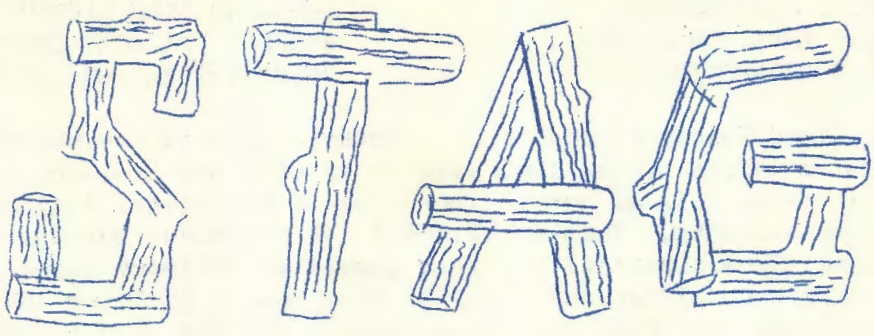

SPRING ORDEAL AT CAMP BUCKEYE TO BE HELD JUNE 14,15, 1963 OVER 100 CANDIDATES TO BE INDUCTED

SIPPO LODGE DELEGATION TO ATTEND 4 D CONFERENCE AT MANSFIELD JUNE 14,15,16

The Annual Spring Ordeal has promise of being a huge success this year at Camp Buckeye, a familiar stamping grounds for Arrowmen.

Roger Haymond currently sparking the campus of Tri State College in Indiana will be the Ringmaster with the whip. As Ordeal master he will be assisted by Eddie Perkins with jovial Billy Jedel serving as Advisor. The Brotherhood Ordeal and Ceremony is slated to be held Friday evening, June 14th. The Ordeal will begin at 6:00 P.M. Friday and be over Saturday night at 11:00 P.M. Ordeal candidates will pay a fee of \$6.00 and other members \$3.00 on arrival. This will include food as well as dues. Nat Benson Rolla Jackson and Bill Stewart will head the ordeal and preordeal ceremonies for the candidates.

All troops and posts who have not held their elections and tapouts yet should do so immediately, it's later than you think. Candidate forms should be sent to Chief Bunting c/o Buckeye Council. If you are planning to take the Brotherhood Initiation, send in your application with name, address and phone number with your time card. At least 15 hours of volunteer service and an ordeal member for at least 10 months is required. May 27th is the deadline for the form and Brotherhood Applications.
